What is the difference?

Silver colored dental amalgam

These types of fillings are made with a combination of elements including silver, tin, copper and mercury.

- Very durable
- Have been safely used for years
- More quickly placed, less technique sensitive
- Usually less costly
- Silver in color

Tooth colored dental composite resins

Composite resin dental fillings are tooth colored to have a more cosmetic appearance.

- Tooth colored
- Provides good durability
- Usually more costly
- More technique sensitive, may need to be replaced more often
